iMATHination 2012 KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Danny Martin is Professor of Education and Mathematics at the University of Illinois at Chicago. He teaches content and methods courses in the undergraduate elementary education program as well as courses in the Ph.D. program in Curriculum and Instruction.

Dr. Martin's research has focused primarily on understanding the salience of race and identity in African American learners' mathematical experiences. Dr. Martin is author of

the book *Mathematics Success and Failure Among African Youth* (2000, Erlbaum) and editor of *Mathematics Teaching, Learning, and Liberation in the Lives of Black Children* (2009, Routledge).

Prior to coming to UIC, he was Instructor and Professor in the Department of Mathematics at Contra Costa College for 14 years, serving as Chair for three years, and was a National Academy of Education/Spencer Foundation Postdoctoral Fellow from 1998-2000.
